

## Industrial Visit Tulya Beverages







Industrial visit to Tulya Beverages Pvt. Ltd., Perambalur, Tamil Nadu, was organized on August 28, 2024, for first-year MBA students. The primary objective of the industrial visit was to provide students with firsthand industrial exposure, enabling them to understand how the renowned brand Tulya Dairy manages its manufacturing processes. The students departed for the visit around 9:30 AM after assembling at M.A.M. B-School early in the morning. Upon their arrival at Tulya Beverages, they were briefed on the policies and procedures to be followed throughout the visit. Ms. Kolila, the Human Resource Management Executive of the plant, provided key insights into the industry, including its history, product line, and quality standards. She emphasized the importance of industrial visits in offering students practical exposure, helping them develop the skills needed to succeed in a competitive environment.

During the tour of the manufacturing line, students were given an overview of the various processes and activities involved in the production of Tulya Beverages' products. First, the homogenization process breaks down larger fat globules, preventing them from separating into a cream layer at the top. This is achieved by forcing pressurized hot milk through small holes, creating turbulence that reduces the size of the fat globules. Homogenization also has implications for health, as it is linked to factors affecting diabetes, milk allergies, coronary heart disease, and atherosclerosis.

The site supervisors provided insights into Tulya Beverages' production process while showcasing their range of products, including fruit drinks, yogurt, and flavored milk, along with their packaging and private labeling services. The students observed the milk processing steps, which included collection, heating to 85 degrees for ½ minute, homogenization, cooking, addition of sugar, color, and essence, followed by bottling, sterilization, labeling, and marketing.

Throughout the visit, students actively engaged with industry representatives, seizing the opportunity to ask questions about various aspects of the sector's operations. During a Q&A session, industry personnel patiently addressed each query, offering students a deeper understanding of the plant's functioning. The visit was meticulously organized and seamlessly executed by Mr. A. Anburaj, the Industrial Visit Coordinator at M.A.M. B-School.

#### **Rane Engine Valve Limited**







In association with National Human Resource Development (NHRD), M. A. M. Business School organized an industrial visit to Rane Engine Valve Limited, Tamil Nadu, on 19.10.2024, for first-year MBA students. The primary objective of the industrial visit was to provide students with firsthand industrial exposure, enabling them to understand how the renowned production company operates its manufacturing processes and maintains quality standards. The students departed for the visit around 1:30 PM after assembling at M.A.M. B-School and then traveled to the industry. Mr. Lawarance, HR Manager at Rane Engine Valve Limited, welcomed the students and conducted a brief session for the students, introducing them to the company's history and basic operations. Established in 1959, the company specializes in manufacturing valves and valve train components for various engine applications. The Rane Group is an auto component manufacturing company that includes several business units, including Rane (Madras) Limited, Rane Brake Lining Limited, Rane Holdings Ltd, Rane Engine Valve Limited, Rane Diecast Limited, and Rane TRW Steering Systems Limited.

During their visit to the valve production plant, students gained insights into the manufacturing process of internal combustion engine (ICE) valves. They observed how highquality heat-resistant alloys are selected and forged into rough valve shapes. CNC machining is then used to precisely form the stem and head, followed by heat treatment to enhance strength and durability. The students also witnessed the grinding and polishing process, ensuring a smooth finish for proper sealing. Additionally, they learned about surface treatments like chrome plating and DLC coating, which reduce wear and friction. They supply to many automobile companies start from two wheeler to car manufacturers. The visit concluded with an overview of quality inspections, including dimensional checks and leakage tests, before the valves are packaged and shipped to engine manufacturers.

Students gained a clear understanding of the production process and had the opportunity to observe the manufacturing floor firsthand. The visit proved to be highly beneficial for the students, enhancing their practical knowledge of industrial operations. Mr. A. Anburaj, the Industrial Visit Coordinator at M.A.M. B-School, made all the arrangement for the visit.


# AUCEK AND LAGE FURNITUI Staff Welfare Committee Team Lunch


